JEWISH CHILDREN IN THE PROTESTANT SCHOOLS OF GREATER MONTREAL
IN THE PERIOD FROM 1878 TO 1958

The purpose of this study is to ascertain the number of Jewish children attending the schools of the Protestant Schecl Board in Greater Montreal during the period of 80 years from 1878 to 1958 , as compared with total enrollment of children in these schools; the changes which have taken place in the percentage of Jewish children to the total enrollment in those schools during that period; the number and percentage of high school children to the total number of children attending all the schools of the Protestant School Board among Jewish school children, as compared with non-Jewish school children; and the movement of the Jewish school population as evidenced by the changes which have taken place in the geographic areas in which those schools are situated in which Jewish children predominate.

The first Board of Protestant School Commissioners in Montreal was appointed under the terms of an Act of the Quebec Provincial Government in 1846, but did not establish any schools of its own until 1850, and in the years from 1846 to 1850 the Board of Protestant School Commissioners subsidized four private schools conducted by Protestant churches and the British and Canadian School. Its first schools, opened in 1850, were established in rented houses, their curriculum was limited to the "Three Ris" -- reading, writing and arithmetic, and the total annual budget was less than $\$ 1,000$. By 1866 the British and Canadian School and several of the Protestant church schools had been transferred to the Montreal Protestant School Board, and the first school building actually built by the Protestant School Boewd in Montreal was the Royal Arthur School built in 1872 on Canning Street in the old area of Montreal south of St. James Street.

The Jewish population of Montreal in 1851 was only 181, and had increased to 409 in 1871, and to 811 by 1881. The number of Jewish children attending the Protestant schools of Montreal increased from only 77 in 1877 te a peak of 14,134 in the Protestant schools of Montreal, Outremont and Westmount in 1924.

The number of Jewish children attending the Protestant schools in Greater Montreal decreased in the eighteen years which followed until it reached an all-time low of 8,590 in 1942, after which the number of Jewish children in the Protestant Schools of Greater Montreal began to increase again; and this numerical increase has continued until the number of Jewish children enrolled in all the Protestant schools of Greater Montreal was 16, 836 as on April 30, 1958. In addition it is estimated that some 4,000 Jewish children in 1958 attended various types of Jewish community and congregational day schools in Montreal which have been established and are maintained without any financial assistance from municipal or provincial taxation, and in which the secular subjects of the Protestant schools are combined with the teaching of Hebrew and Jewish religious and cul-: tural subjects.

The percentage of Jewish children among the total enrollment in the Protestant schools of Greater Montreal increased from 2.3 percent in 1877 to a peak of 44.4 percent in 1916, decreased to an all-time low of 23.8 percent in 1948, and has increased in subsequent years to 27.9 percent in 1958.

The total enrollment in the Protestant schools in the city of Montreal and the number of Jewish children eniciled in those schools in the years 1877, 1891, 1899 and in each of the years from 1901 to 1923 inclusive will be found in Table l, while the total enrollment and number of Jewish children enrolled in the Protestant elementary and high schools of Greater Montreal in each of the years 1924 to 1958 inclusive will be found in Table 2.

The statistics in Table 1 showing the total enrollment and the number of Jewish children attending the Protestant schools in the period from 1878 to 1923 are for the month of September as given in the annual reports of the Protestant Eoard of Schocl Commissioners of the City of Montreal, while the statistice for the years from 1924 to 1958 in Table 2 are from the official statolucs of the Protestant Schocl Boards showing the religious classification of pupils as at April 30 th in each year, with the exception of the statistics for the years 1942 to 1948 inclusive which are the approximate $\mathrm{cm}-\cdots \mathrm{m}$ ontatistics in the month of December. For the year 1058 statistics are given for the months of April and December.

Official stati, of the enrollmont of Jewish children in the Protestant High Schools in Greater Montreai are not available for the years prior to 1924, but the total enrollmeat and the number of Jewish children in the Protestant High Schools and Elementary Schools of Greater Nontreal in each of the years from 1924 to 1958 inclusive, and the perontage of Jewish children among the total enrollment in the high schools and elementary schools will be found in Table 2.

The statistics thow theare 192! to 1947 inclusive in Table 2 are for the Protestant schoole in the oitees of MCntreal, Outremont and Westmount only, while the stati ios for the years 1948 to 1958 inclusive include all the schonls within the suburben aweas of Greater lontreal, sweh as St. Laurent, Mount Royal, Verdun, Hampstead, etuc.

There were very few, if any, Jewisin children in the Protestant schools in the suburban areas beyond the boundaries of Montreal, Outremont and Westmount prior to 1948 , so that it may be assured thats for all practical purposes the statistics of the emrolment of Jewish pupils in the elenentary and high schools given in Table 2 include all jewish child en attending the Protestant schools in Greater Montreal in each of the years from 192! to 1958 inclusive.

The number of Jewish children in the elementary schools of Greater Montreal decreased from 12,015 in 1924 to a low point of 5.778 in 1945, and has increased steadily each year since 1915 to 12,222 in Decemier 1958; while the number of Jewish children enrolled : $\%$ the Protestant High Schools of Metropolitan Montreal increased from 2, 219 in 1924 to a peak of 2,729 in 1931, decreased to 2,347 in 1932, fluctrated slightly in the period from 1933 to 1942, and resumed its increase in 1943, reaching a peak of 5, 14" in 1958.

The percentage of Jewish children among the total enrollment in the Protestant elementary schools of Greater Montreal has decreased from 34.7 percent in 1924 to 23.9 percent in 1952, and has increased slightly to 27.2 percent in December 1958. The numerical decrease in the emrollment of Jewish children in the Protestant elementary schools is largely due to the establishment and development of Jewish congregational and community day schools since 1932. While the percentage of Jewish children among the total enrollment in the protestant high schools decreased from 48.7 percent in 1924 to 24.4 percent in 1950 and has increased to 32.8 percent in December 1958, the number of Jewish children in the Protestant high schools of Greater Montreal has increased from 2,119 in 1924 to 2,729 in 1931, decreased to an all-time low of 2,347 in 1932, increased again to 2,854 in 1937, and after some minor fluctuations in the period from 1938 to 1947, has continued to increase in number to a peak of $5,11_{1}$ in 1958.

The percentage of all Jewish children in the Protestant schools of Greater Montreal who attended the high schools has exceeded the percentage of all non-Jewish children enrolled in the Protestant schools who attended high schools in every one of the years from 1924 to 1958 inclusive. (See Table 3.)

The percentage of all Jewish children in the Protestant schools of Greater Montreal who attended the high schools in 1924 was 15.0 percent as compared with 9.0 percent among non-Jewish children, and was 30.6 percent among Jewish children in 1958 as compared with 24.9 percent among non-Jewish children. (See Table 3.)

There were 11 Protestant schools in Greater Montreal in 1924 in which the majority of the children enrolled were Jewish. Those schools and the percentage of Jewish children to the total enrollment were Devonshire (97.3\%), Mount Royal ( $96.8 \%$ ), Bancroft ( $89.4 \%$ ), Baron Byng High ( $89.2 \%$ ), Aberdeen ( $87.4 \%$ ), Commercial High (79.8\%), Strathearn (79.8\%), Alexandria (77.9\%), Amherst (70.0\%), Fairmount ( $62.4 \%$ ), and Dufferin (55.1\%). All of these 11 Protestant schools in which the majority of the children enrolled in 1924 were Jewish were situated in the old area of settlement between Hutchison and St. Denis Streets.

The Jewish children attending the aforementioned 11 Protestant schools in which they formed the majority of the children enrolled in 1924 formed 72 percent of the total enrollment of Jewish children in all the Protestant schools in Greater Montreal.

In 1928 the number of Protestant schools in Greater Montreal in which the majority of the children enrolled were Jewish had decreased to 9, all of which were situated in the old area of settlement east of Hutchison Street. These 9 schools were Mount Royal ( $98.2 \%$ ), Baron Byng High ( $97.5 \%$ ), Devonshire ( $96.7 \%$ ), Bancroft ( $95.3 \%$ ), Fairmount (79.0\%), Strathearn ( $68.7 \%$ ), Commercial High (68.7) and Alexandra (50\%).

The Jewish children attending those 9 Protestant schools in which they formed the majority of the children enrolled in 1928 formed 76 percent of the total enrollment of Jewish children in all the Protestant schools in Greater Montreal.

By 1948 the number of Protestant schools in Greater Montreal in which the majority of the children in attendance were Jewish had increased to 11, of which 7 were in the old area of settlement east of Hutchison Street, 3 were
in Outremont and one was in the Snowdon district. These 11 schools were Baron Byng High ( $98.9 \%$ ), Fairmount ( $92.2 \%$ ), Mount Royal ( $88.9 \%$ ), Bancroft ( $88.3 \%$ ), Alfred Joyce ( $82.9 \%$ ), Guy Drummond ( $78.5 \%$ ), Strathcona ( $77.4 \%$ ), Devonshire ( $69.8 \%$ ), Iona (57.2\%), Edward VII (54.5\%) and Cormercial High ( $50.8 \%$ ).

The Jewish children attending these 11 Protestant schools in which they formed the majority of the children enrolled in 1948 formed 78 percent of the total enrollment of Jewish children in all the Protestant schools in Greater Montreal.

By 1958 the number of Protestant schools in Greater Montreal in which the majority of the children enrolled were Jewish had increased to 18, of which only three schools, Baron Byng High, Fairmount and Bancroft were situated in the old area of settlement, and 15 schools were in the newer residential areas of Montreal west of Hutchison Street, and in the suburbs of Outremont, St. Laurent, and Hampstead.

The three Protestant schools in Greater Montreal with the largest number of Jewish children in attendance in 1958 were Northmount High (1,196), Outremont High ( 1,005 ), and Van Horne ( 1,005 ), all of them in the newest residential areas west of Hutchison Street. The 18 Protestant schools in which the majority of the children in attendance in 1958 were Jewish were Baron Byng High (90.3\%), Northmount High (88.3\%), Outremont High ( $86.0 \%$ ), Logan ( $83.7 \%$ ), Garden View ( $82.2 \%$ ), Alfred Joyce ( $81.3 \%$ ), Van Horne ( $79.9 \%$ ), Fairmount ( $78.9 \%$ ), Guy Drummond ( $78.2 \%$ ), Iona ( $78.7 \%$ ), Strathcona ( $76.6 \%$ ). Westminster ( $74.2 \%$ ), Bancroft ( $72.7 \%$ ), Coronation ( $69.2 \%$ ), Merton ( $64.4 \%$ ), Btdford ( $63.9 \%$ ), Royal Vale (52.9\%) and Hampstead (50.6).

The total enrollment and the number of Jewish children in those Protestant schools in Greater Montreal in the period from 1924 to 1958 in which Jewish children formed the majority in 1958 will be found in Table 4, while the percentage of Jewish children among the total enrollment in those schcols will be found in Table 5.

In Table 6 will be found the total enrollment and the number of Jewish children in the period from 1924 to 1958 in those Protestant schrols in Greater Montreal in which Jewish children formed the majority at some time but no longer do so, while the percentage of Jewish children among the total enrollment in those schools will be found in Table 7.

The total enrollment and the number of Jewish children attending all Protestant schools in Montreal and each of the suburban areas in Metropolitan Montreal on April 30 in each of the years 1954 to 1958 inclusive will be found in Table 8, while the total enrollment and the number of Jewish children in each of the years from 1954 to 1958 inclusive in which Jewish children have never formed the majority will be found in Table 9.

Before World War II the majority of the children attending the Protestant Schools in Greater Montreal attended schools in the neighbourhood in which they lived, but with the migration of the population into new suburban residential areas, and the delay which usually takes place before schools are erected in the new residential areas, it has been found necessary in some cases to convey school children by bus from the new neighbourhood in which they live to a school in another district which may be a considerable distance away. In 1955 the number of Jewish children conveyed by bus from the area in which they lived to the district in which the school they attended was situated was 734,
and this number increased to 1,402 in 1958. Of these 485 Jewish children resident in Montreal in 1955 attended schools in Outremont, while of the 1,055 Jewish children resident in Montreal in 1958 who attended schools in the suburban areas, 670 attended Protestant schools in Outremont, 217 attended schools in the town of Mount Royal, 155 attended schools in Westmount, and a few were conveyed to schools in St. Laurent and Montreal West. (See Table 10.) On the other hand, 249 Jewish children resident in suburban areas such as Outremont, Hampstead, Cote St. Luc and St. Laurent in 1955 were conveyed to schools in Montreal or other suburban areas, and 347 Jewish children resident in St. Laurent, Hampstead, Cote St. Luc and Outremont attended schools in the city of Montreal. Most of these children were attending the high schools.

## SUMMARY

The number of Jewish children attending the Protestant schools of Greater Montreal increased from 77 in 1877 to a peak of 14,134 in 1924, decreased to an all-time low of 8,590 in 1942, and has since increased to a peak of 16,836 in 1958.

Jewish children among the total enrollment in the protestant schools of Greater Montreal increased from 2.3 percent in 1877 to a peak of 44.4 percent in 1926, then decreased to an al1-time low of 23.8 percent in 1948, and have increased to 27.9 percent in 1958. In addition, about 4,000 Jewish children in Greater Montreal receive their secular and Jewish education in the varicus types of Jewish community and congregational schools which have been established and are maintained without any financial assistance from municipal or provincial tax funds.

The percentage of all Jewish children in the Protestant schools in Greater Montreal enrolled in high schools in 1924 was 15 percent as compared with 9 percent among non-Jewish children, and had increased to 30.6 percent among Jewish children in 1958, as compared with 24.9 percent among non-Jewish children in the Protestant schools of Greater Montreal.

In 1924 Jewish children formed the majority in eleven of the 66 Protestant schools in Greater Montreal, and all of these eleven schools were in the old area of Jewish settlement between Hutchison and St. Denis Streets. In addition Jewish children formed more than 20 percent but less than 50 percent of the children enrolled in the Strathcona Academy in Outremont and the Montreal High School for Boys and the Montreal High School for Girls in 1924.

In 1958 Jewish children formed the majority in 18 of the 89 Protestant schools in Greater Montreal, and of these only three, Baron Byng High School, Bancroft and Fairmount Schools were in the old area of Jewish settlement east of Hutchison Street, four were in Outremont, nine were in the newer residential areas of Snowdon, Cote des Neiges and Notre Dame de Grace; and one each in St. Laurent and Hampstead. There were also 15 schools in 1958 in which Jewish children formed more than 20 but less than 50 percent of the total enrollment, and of these only two schools, Edward VII and Devonshire were in the uld area of Jewish settlement east of Hutchison Street, while the other 13 schools were in Westmount, the Town of Mount Royal, and the Cote des Neiges and Notre Dame de Grace districts of Montreal.
